## BBAA - BOARD MEMBER AUTHORITY

The powers delegated to a school board by the state are delegated to the board as a whole. No authority is granted board members acting as individuals.

The Board exercises its powers and duties only in properly called meetings, where a majority of the Board constitutes a quorum to transact business. Except when performing a specific duty as ordered by the Board, the decision and actions of a single member of the Board are not binding on the entire Board.

## DUTIES AND/OR OBLIGATIONS OF INDIVIDUAL BOARD MEMBERS:

The duties and/or obligations of an individual Board Member may be enumerated as follows:

- 2. To familiarize him/herself with the State School Laws, regulations of the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, Highmore-Harrold School District #34-2 policies and regulations.
- 3. To have general knowledge of educational aims and objectives of the school system.
- 4. To work harmoniously with other Board Members without trying either to dominate the Board or neglect his/her shares of work.
- 5. To vote and act in the Board meetings impartially for the good of the district.
- 6. To accept the will of the majority vote in all cases and give wholehearted support to the resulting policy.
- 7. To represent the Board and the Highmore-Harrold Schools to the public in such a way as to promote both interest and support.
- 8. To refer complaints to the proper school authorities and to abstain from individual counsel and action.
